



## Pupil Premium

The pupil premium is additional funding received by schools to raise achievements for pupils.

The pupil premium funding is allocated to children from families in receipt of:

- Working tax credit
- Child Tax Credit with no working Tax Credit and where the household income is less than £16,190
- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment Support Allowance
- Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of the state pension

Pupil premium is also available for schools to claim to benefit:

- Pupils who are looked after or in care
- Pupils whose parents are in the armed forces.

This is paid at a different rate to the first group.

The funding was first introduced in April 2011 and since then, has increased year on year. The money is for schools to decide how to use, but the focus in our school is to improve the educational attainment and experience for pupil premium children. It does not affect benefit claims in any way.

It is very important that parents inform school if they fall into any of the above categories in order for school to be able to access the funding which your child and school is entitled to benefit from. We would like to reassure all parents that your child will not be identified publicly in any way if they receive this funding and that all information collected is kept confidential.

### Impact on progress 2018-2019

The Impact of pupil premium interventions on the progress of children. We had 5 disadvantaged children in the cohort, 2 of which were SEND. These 2 children joined school in year 4 and year 5 so this will also have an impact on the progress they have made at our school.

As there were 5 children in the cohort each child represents 20%.

### Reading

We had 3 children so each child represents 33%

- In Year 6, 1 of the 3 Pupil Premium children achieved the expected standard in reading which equates to 33% compared to 72% of the other pupils in the class and 73% of children nationally.

## **Writing**

- In Year 6, 1 of the 3 Pupil Premium children achieved the expected standard in writing which equates to 33% compared to 78% of the other pupils in the class and 78% of children nationally.

## • **Maths**

- In Year 6, 1 of the 3 Pupil Premium children achieved the expected standard in maths which equates to 33% compared to 69% of the other pupils in the class and 79% of children nationally.

## • **Grammar Spelling and Punctuation**

- In Year 6, 1 of the 3 Pupil Premium children achieved the expected standard in grammar, spelling and punctuation which equates to 33% compared to 72% of the other pupils in the class and 78% of children nationally.

## • **Reading Writing and Maths Combined**

- In Year 6, 1 of the 3 Pupil Premium children achieved the expected standard in reading writing and maths which equates to 33% compared to 59% of the other pupils in the class and 65% of children nationally.

The Impact of pupil premium interventions on the progress of children. We had 7 disadvantaged children in the cohort, 1 of which was SEND, 1 of joined school at the end of KS2 with English as an additional language and 1 joined us halfway through year 6. As there were 7 children in the cohort each child represents 14%.
